

Our Mission

The Nebraska Crossroads Music Festival strives to highlight and celebrate the rich and diverse cultural heritage of our community through creative and conscientious musical programming, storytelling, and workshops.

The Festival Is:

- Transformative performances with world-class artists
- Jam sessions and poetry slams open to public participation
- Kids concerts

The Artists

- 12-18 internationally-recognized touring artists
- 40-50 local artists and storytellers, representing cultural traditions that span the globe and call Nebraska home.

The Concerts

Multiple genres including <u>classical</u>, world-, <u>folk-</u>, and traditional music, <u>hip-hop</u> to <u>Hindustani</u> and <u>jazz</u> to electronica. Always representing the **highest artistic standard** and **telling relevent stories of today**. We also take pride in performing in creative venues, fitting the music into the best space for the optimal experience.

Cross-Cultural Exchange

Nebraska has become a multi-cultural hub. The festival buzzes with an electric synergy between visiting artist, local artists and the community.

Achievements

The Festival was <u>awarded a \$40,000 Arts Project Grant</u> from the **National Endowment for the Arts** to support our 2025 festival, making our organizations the youngest ever in Nebraska to receive such an award.

La Folia Global by Valeri Tolstov, commissioned by the Nebraska Crossroads Music Festival in 2023, was recently <u>featured at the Kuhmo International</u> Chamber Music Festival in Finland with Crossroads Artists in July, 2024.

Getting Here

Driving

Both Lincoln and Omaha are located right along I-80 and going between cities is not as long as you think! You can get from Downtown Omaha to Lincoln in under one hour. There's also plenty to see between the two cities,

including the <u>Strategic Air Command Air and Space Museum</u>, the <u>Platte River State Park</u> and the <u>Holy Family Shrine</u>.

Parking

Both Lincoln and Omaha have plenty of street parking, which can be used with credit cards or the passport app, and ample garage parking.

Flying

Both Lincoln and Omaha have modern and well-connected airports: LNK (Lincoln) and OMA (OMA). Omaha's airport is somewhat bigger and is serviced by a number of airlines. LNK is serviced exclusively by United.

Getting Around in Town

Both Lincoln and Omaha have a robust Uber/Lyft scene and it's an easy way to get around if you're without a car. However, there is a quite practical and inexpensive bus service in both cities (StarTran in Lincoln/Omaha Metro)

Hotels/Airbnb

Stay with the Artists at The Graduate Hotel in Lincoln, or enjoy the hospitality of many of the other wonderful hotels in both cities; plenty of options on Airbnb, too!

Kinan Azmeh

Syrian-born Kinan Azmeh is an internationally acclaimed clarinetist and composer, celebrated for his genre-defying blend of classical, jazz, and Arabic folk music. A member of Yo-Yo Ma's Silkroad Ensemble, he has performed at Carnegie Hall, the Berlin Philharmonie, and the Royal Albert Hall. His compositions have been commissioned by major orchestras worldwide, and his work explores themes of migration, identity, and cultural dialogue. Dawn of Midi

Dawn of Midi is an experimental acoustic trio from Brooklyn, consisting of pianist Amino Belyamani, bassist Aakaash Israni, and drummer Qasim Nagvi. Known for their minimalist, rhythmically intricate sound, they craft trancelike compositions that mimic electronic music but are performed entirely on acoustic instruments. Their critically acclaimed 2015 album Dysnomia showcases their unique ability to blend genres, creating a mechanical, hypnotic feel without the use of electronics. Dawn of Midi has captivated audiences around the world with their innovative, genre-defying approach to music.

Erdem Helvacioclu

Erdem Helvacioclu is a renowned Turkish electric guitarist, composer, and sound artist celebrated for his innovative fusion of contemporary classical, ambient, and experimental music. His works explore the intersection of technology and music, utilizing live electronics, prepared guitars, and immersive soundscapes. Helvacioclu has released critically acclaimed albums, collaborated with international artists, and composed for film and theater. His genre-defying approach has earned accolades worldwide. positioning him as a pioneering figure in Turkey's avant-garde and global music scene. Listen here!

Layale Chaker & Sarafand

Sarafand is a dynamic ensemble led by acclaimed Lebanese violinist and composer Lavale Chaker. Known for their innovative fusion of classical, Arabic, and contemporary music, the group creates a sound that transcends genres while honoring traditional roots. Chaker's compositions are deeply influenced by the rich musical heritage of the Levant, but she skillfully blends these elements with modern classical and jazz influences, crafting an evolving and intricate soundscape. Sarafand's performances are distinguished by their expressive depth, masterful improvisation, and the interplay of traditional and contemporary instruments. The ensemble's music explores themes of memory,



migration, and cultural dialogue, offering audiences a profound listening experience that bridges East and West.
