Kinan Azmeh – Clarinet/ Composer



Azmeh, a Brooklyn-based, genre-bending composer and clarinetist, has been touring the

globe with great acclaim as a soloist, composer and improviser. He has collaborated with Yo-Yo Ma. Daniel Barenboim, John McLaughlin, Aynur and Djivan Gasparian among others. His recent orchestral album, Uneven Sky with the Deutsches Symphony Orchestra Berlin, won Germany's OpusKlassik Award in 2019. A graduate of The Juilliard School, the Damascus High Institute of Music, and Damascus University's School of Electrical Engineering, Azmeh holds a doctorate in music from the City University of New York. His first opera. Songs For Days To Come. premiered in Germany in June 2022. He has recently been appointed to the National Council for the Arts following a nomination by President Joe Biden.

Layale Chaker – Violin/ Composer



Raised on the verge of several musical streams since her childhood, Lebanese violinist and composer

Layale Chaker debuted her musical training at the National Higher Conservatory of Beirut in her native Lebanon. She later pursued her

musical studies at Conservatoire de Paris, the Royal Academy of Music in London, and Ecole des Hautes Etudes in Paris. Lavale has appeared as a soloist, performer, improviser and composer in concerts, recitals and projects around Europe, the Middle East, North and South America and Asia. She debuted her first violin concerto with the Bayreuther Philharmoniker as the orchestra's first-ever commissioned composer in January 2018. Lavale Chaker is a Ruth Anderson 2017 Competition Prize winner, the recipient of the Royal Academy of Music's 2018 Guinness Award and a finalist of the Rolex Mentor and Protégé 2018 Prize.

Pablo Humberto Garca Chávez – Drums/percussion



Pablo Humberto Garcia Chavez was born in the city of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, into a family of

artists. At the age of seven, he was enrolled in the Lauro Fuentes Music School where he began playing percussion. After graduating, he began playing in various orchestras in cultural venues throughout Cuba and at 19, he emigrated to Mexico joining an orchestra called "Los Tilihalas," opening for the maestro Arturo Sandoval in Cancun. In 2017, he moved to the United States and settled in Marshalltown, lowa, where he pursues various musical projects including the band, Andy Williams and the Nebraska All-Star's.

Myra Coveney – Clarinet Academist



Myra Coveney is the Nebraska Crossroads Music Festival's very first academy student. Myra is a

student of Dr. Season Cowley at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. In her undergrad career, Myra held the role of principal clarinet for the Heartland Philharmonic Orchestra, as well as principal clarinet for the UNO Symphonic Wind Ensemble. Recently Myra participated in the lab orchestra during a fellowship with the Conducting Institute in Ft. Worth, Texas, as principal and second clarinetist.

Sarah Darling – Viola/Violin



Described as "a tireless force of musical curiosity, skill, and enthusiasm" and "the one to up the

ante" (Boston Musical Intelligencer), Sarah Darling enjoys a varied musical career as a performer, educator, and musical co-conspirator on viola and baroque violin. She is a member of the Grammy-nominated selfconducted orchestra A Far Cry, as well as Boston Baroque, Musicians of the Old Post Road, Emmanuel Music, the Boston Ballet Orchestra, the Boston Camerata, the Boston Early Music Festival, and the Carmel Bach Festival. Sarah studied at Harvard, Juilliard, Amsterdam, Freiburg, and New England Conservatory, working with James Dunham, Karen Tuttle, Wolfram Christ, Nobuko Imai, and Kim Kashkashian. She has recorded old and new music for Linn, Paladino, Azica, MSR, Centaur and Crier Records, plus a solo album on Naxos. Sarah is active as a teacher and coach, relishing the opportunity to "translate" between musical worlds while serving on the faculty of the Longy School of Music and co-directing the Harvard Baroque Chamber Orchestra.

Sandeep Das – Tabla



A 2020 Guggenheim Fellow, Sandeep Das is one of the leading Tabla virtuosos in the world today. Since

his debut concert at the age of 17 with legendary Sitarist Pt. Ravi Shankar, Das has established himself as one of India's top Tabla maestros, building a prolific international reputation that spans over three decades.

In addition to performing at major Indian music festivals with renowned musicians such as Pt. Hariprasad Chaurasia, Pt. Shivkumar Sharma, and Ust. Amjad Ali Khan, among others, he is one of the unique Indian Classical musicians to expand beyond his traditional roots and collaborate with musicians from across the globe. Das actively performs with and composes for major symphony orchestras, string quartets, jazz musicians, world music

ensembles and many other unique groups with regularly featured concerts at Carnegie Hall, the Lincoln Center, the Hollywood Bowl, the Royal Albert Hall and the Concertgebouw, to name a few.

Das has performed at prestigious events such as the 150th annual celebration of the UNO at the General Assembly Hall in NYC, the opening ceremony of the Special Olympics in Shanghai, the opening ceremony of the 1st Asia Expo in Kunming, China, the World Economic Forum, the BBC Proms and for visiting dignitaries such as the Queen of England, the Queen of Thailand, the Pope and various other world leaders.

Nikki Divall - Viola



Nikki Divall was a core member of the Australian Chamber Orchestra from 2005 to 2020. A

graduate of the

Canberra School of Music, she left Australia in 1992 to begin graduate studies at the University of North Texas before entering the Emerson Quartet Graduate String Quartet program at the Hartt School of Music.

She has held the position of Principal Viola with the Ohio Chamber Orchestra, the Cleveland Chamber Symphony, the Cleveland-San Jose Ballet, the Cleveland Opera and Sydney Philharmonia. She has appeared as Guest Principal with the Sydney Symphony Orchestra, the Australian Chamber Orchestra, and most recently, Handel and Haydn

Society and Albany Symphony. Divall is currently Principal Viola of Cleveland's baroque ensemble, Apollo's Fire, and a core member of Four Nations Ensemble.

Séamus Egan – Irish Instruments



It's hard to think of an artist in traditional Irish music more influential than Seamus Egan. From

his beginnings as a teen prodigy, to his groundbreaking solo work with Shanachie Records, to his founding of the Irish American powerhouse band Solas, to his current work as one of the leading composers and interpreters of the tradition, Egan has inspired multiple generations of musicians and helped define the sound of Irish music today.

Katrine Grarup Elbo – Violin



Katrine Grarup Elbo is a violinist, composer and performer based in Copenhagen and Berlin. Her

work often combines improvisation, composition, performance and installation. In addition to her own creative practice, she enjoys playing both chamber music and symphony orchestra. She is a founder and core member of Danish sound collective, We like We (f. 2012), Berlin based string ensemble, toechter, the neo classical duo, Søndag Søndag (f. 2019), and performance duo, La Mia

Bella Sorella, with soloist from The Royal Danish Ballet, Astrid Grarup Elbo. Her first solo release, the EP SLUTSANG / endpoem for five young voices and solo violin with electronic effects, was released digitally and on limited edition cassette tape by MoBC in August 2020. Her first full studio album, Fold Unfold, was released by the acknowledged German label Sonic Pieces, on vinyl, CD, and digitally in April 2021.

Maeve Gilchrist - Celtic Harp



Edinburgh-born harpist and composer Maeve Gilchrist has been credited as an innovator on her

native instrument and has taken the Celtic (lever) Harp to new levels of performance and visibility. Currently based in Kingston, NY, Gilchrist tours internationally as a solo artist and composer and is a member of the grammy-nominated Silkroad ensemble, Arooj Aftab's Grammy winning Vulture Prince Ensemble, and of the multi-disciplinary quartet, Edges of Light. She has performed and recorded with such luminaries as Yo-Yo Ma, Frankie Gavin, Esperanza Spalding, Bruce Molsky, Ambrose Akinmusire and Solas. As a composer, Gilchrist straddles the worlds of folk and classical with an ever-increasing number of chamber and orchestral works. Gilchrist is the music and co-artistic director of the Rockport Celtic festival, an innovative new festival focused on cross-curation and the outer-fringes of Celtic Music.

Humberto Raul Garcia Gonzalez – Keyboard, Saxophone



Son of Humberto Garcia Vidal and Maria del Carmen Gonzalez Puig, Humberto Raul Garcia Gonzales

was born in 1978 in Cuba. His mother is a theory and solfege teacher, composer, singer, and pianist, so it's no surprise that his passion for music was ignited from an early age. He began his musical studies in classical violin at the age of six at the prestigious Esteban Salas Conservatory Art School, switching to saxophone three years later.

His professional career started in 1986, performing with several orchestras including "Granma," "La Idea," "Banda XL," "Suena Cubano" and "Moneda Nacional," touring throughout Central America and the Caribbean. In the year 2000, he joined the legendary Buena Vista Social Club, touring across Europe, Africa, Central and South America, and served as the group's musical director, administrator, arranger and pianist.

In 2006, he emigrated to Mexico, started his life as an independent artist, and toured the country accompanying renowned artists like Barry Ivan White, Miguel Angel Cespedes, Francisco Cespedes and Denise de Calaf, Garcia Gonzalez

recently emigrated to the United States and is based in lowa.

Erik Higgins – Double Bass



Nebraska Crossroads Music Festival founder and Artistic Director Erik Higgins spends most of the

year as a double bassist performing, recording and touring with chamber music and other projects. He especially enjoys crossover projects and bringing together people from different musical backgrounds, which probably won't surprise you if you've been to a Crossroads performance before. Higgins lives with his family in Denmark.

John Hadfield - Percussion



As a composer and percussionist, John Hadfield's dedication to music has taken him from his native

Missouri to performing globally. He has released four albums of his own compositions and composes for many projects. Hadfield also composed and performed in Apologue 2047, a multimedia performance art piece directed by Zhang Yimou which explored themes of the relationships of humans and technology.

John has also performed with the Saturday Night Live Band, Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra, and the Silk Road Ensemble. He has collaborated on more than 100 recordings, including GRAMMY award winning albums.

Emmanuel Hovhannisyan – Duduk



Emmanuel Hovhannisyan is one of the most accomplished musicians in Armenia. He is

first duduk player at the Armenian State Orchestra of National Instruments, solo player at Tagharan Ancient Music Ensemble and lead duduk player at the Gurdjieff Folk Instruments Ensemble. Together with the latter ensemble, Hovhannisyan collaborated in the production of the Ensemble's CD, The Voice of George Gurdijeff (German ECM Records Company), which received a high appraisal from the musical world in line with several prestigious international awards.

Alongside his permanent commitments at the Conservatory of Yerevan and various ensembles, Hovhannisyan also has an extensive record of collaboration with various musical projects: New Voices of Duduk, Arie Toun (Come Back Home), Beiteddine Art Festival, Roots Revival Festival and the Hamazgayin Theatre of Yerevan, where he performs live at different theatre performances and even in roles as an actor.

Edwin Huizinga – violin



Over the last decade, Edwin Huizinga has crossed many borders and boundaries as

an artist around the world. He is finding new and unique ways to connect with audiences, performing in different genres, on various stages and platforms, and always striving to commit and connect with the community. Huizinga is a founding member of ACRONYM, a world-renowned baroque ensemble, and Fire & Grace, which gives him the opportunity to share modern baroque premieres, new arrangements and compositions with the musical community.

Huizinga is a professor of baroque violin at Oberlin Conservatory the Artistic Director of the Sweetwater Music Festival and also the Director of the Baroque and Classical Academy at the Carmel Bach Festival. Huizinga loves to compose and works with a vast number of artists in the world of rock and roll, ambient music, as well as with Opera Atelier and the National Arts Centre Orchestra in Canada on contemporary and historically informed collaborations as well.

Ingeri Japhet – Multi-instrument



Ingeri Japhet, a singer, songwriter, and keyboard player from Kigali, Rwanda, is a

dynamic artist making waves in the music industry. As a key member of an Afro-fusion Live-live band. he brings unparalleled energy to their performances. Ingeri's musical prowess extends beyond stages at small restaurants to massive stadium. shows. Notably, he has showcased his talent at renowned venues such as The Nebraska LIED Center. the Nebraska History Museum, the annual University of Nebraska-Lincoln Commencements, since 2021, Nebraska Wesleyan University, and Lincoln Calling, İngeri's captivating presence and undeniable talent continue to leave an indelible mark on the music scene.

Rajib Karmaker – Sitar



Rajib Karmakar is a Los Angeles based performer, composer and educator. He has played and been

featured in various movies and TV shows for Disney, Warner Bros... Sony, Universal, A&E network and many more. He has collaborated and performed with top musicians like Herb Alpert, Beck, Chris Martin, Sandeep Das, Kayhan Kalhor, Wu Tong and many others. He has performed in iconic venues like Shrine Auditorium, Lincoln Center, Walt Disney Concert Hall, National Arts Centre, the Straz Center and has given lectures at various schools, colleges and universities all over the world. He is currently the Artistic Director of Los Angeles International Music and Arts Academy and

President of LAIMA Foundation.

Benoit Kayigamba – Guitar



Benoit (Ben) Kayigamba is a skilled Rwandan multiinstrumentalist, composer, and

educator. With expertise in keys. guitars, and music production. Kavigamba's talent knows no bounds. As the music director for Live-Lyve band, an electrifying Afro-fusion group, he blends diverse influences to create unforgettable performances celebrating music's power and cultural expression. With notable appearances at renowned venues like the Lied Center, Lincoln-Calling, AfrOmaha, and prestigious events such as UNL's annual commencements. Kavigamba's musical arrangements and exceptional musicianship captivate audiences. In 2022, the band embarked on a successful tour. leaving an indelible mark on the music scene. Currently, Kayigamba is co-producing Starruwa's album set to be released in late fall 2023.

Hasan Khalil – Keyboard



Hasan Khalil was born near Mt. Sinjar in Northern Iraq. With his parents in the late 1980s, his family escaped

the war and persecution when he was 3 years old, moving to Syria where he spend most of his life in

refugee camps. When he was 14, his family made its way to the United States, first to Buffalo, NY and then to Lincoln NE. They were among the first of what would become around 5,000 Yazidis, most of them fleeing religious persecution and genocide. Khalil is a self-taught musician and improvises and composes his music. Khalil believes it is a universal language and through it, we can all listen to one another's stories, learn about other cultures, and freely express our emotions.

Daniel Martinez - Guitar



Daniel Martinez, Flamenco guitar stylist, composer and teacher hails from Iquitos, Peru. Growing up

surrounded by the ocean and the Amazon Rainforest, Martinez first picked up the guitar as a young teen at the encouragement of his mother.

Martinez honed his skills through the mastery of classical guitar training and preparing for and winning national guitar competitions. He has performed in South America, Canada and across the U.S. Today, five solo instrumental recordings later, he is a sought-after instructor and a familiar presence on stages in the region. Martinez is a guitar professor at Union College in Lincoln, NE, and offers private and group lessons for all ages and abilities, as well.

Janet Morales – vocals



Janet Morales was born in 1986 in Santiago de Cuba to the dancer Alicia Fonseca and the legendary trumpet

player Rafael Morales Jorge. She began her studies at the age of six at the Jose Maria Heredia Vocational Art School, starting her career as a classical violinist, switching to her true passion, singing, two years later. She later moved to Mexico, teaching music and continuing her career as a solo singer and backing vocalist in various genres like jazz, soul, blues, bossa nova, country music, rock and roll, R&B, reggae, son, guarachas, chachachas, salsa, cumbias, merengues, bachatas and others. She appeared on Televisa with the Karenka Orchestra and shared the stage with artists like Reily Barba. Miguel Angel Cespedes and others. Upon her arrival in the United States. she formed her own orchestra called "Janet v su Sangre Latina" and also performs with other projects.

Yordano Parsons Reina – Bass



Yordano Parsons Reina was born in Cuba and in 1994 began studying music with Professor

Ángela Norbert. In 2005, he started touring internationally with Andy Gola, performing in Sweden, Italy and Spain. In 2007, he moved to Cancun, Mexico, performing for the Iberostar Resorts hotel chain. At the same time, he continued freelancing with other groups in the Riviera Mava, a place known worldwide for its cultural diversity. By 2011. he had become an independent artist and participated in groups and festivals throughout the United States, emigrating there in 2014 and continuing to perform throughout the country.

Oscar Rios Pohirieth – Andean instruments



Pohirieth helps students learn unique instruments that they have often never seen or heard before. He

analyzes the history, development and playing techniques of various Native Andean instruments such as the Zampoñas (Andean Pan Pipes), the Quena (a recorder-like flute) and the Bombo (drum from African influence), to name a few. Through this process, Pohirieth creates curiosity, cooperation and collaboration for exploring new

music and culture.

Sarah Rowe – Visual arts



Sarah Rowe is a multimedia artist based in Omaha, NE, and her work is featured in all of the 2023 festival

materials, including this booklet. Her work opens cross cultural dialogues by utilizing methods of painting, sculpture, performance and Native American ceremony in unconventional ways. Rowe's work is participatory, a call to action, and re-imagines traditional Native American symbology to fit the narrative of today's global landscape. Her imagined landscapes are bold and vibrant, containing a shape-shifting bestiary of tales both familiar and strange. Rowe holds a BA in Studio Art from Webster University and has studied in St. Louis, MO, and Vienna, Austria. She is of Lakota and Ponca descent.

Marie-Claire Schlameus – cello



Marie-Claire
Schlameus is a
composer, producer
and musician. She
explores the full
percussive and

lyrical range of the cello, drawing on sound-effect worlds created through electronic production and vocal textures. With her set up she performs in co-founded projects, toechter, and Sometimes with Others Since 2021, she is the cellist of Agnes

Obel's Live Band and the German rapper CASPER. She studied cello at the University for Music and Theater, Leipzig.

Olga Smola – violin



A native of Siberia, Russia, Nebraska Crossroads Music Festival Executive Director Olga Smola is a versatile

violinist, arranger, improviser and composer. Smola plays solo and ensemble performances in many different styles of music including classical, jazz, rock, country and electronic music as a violin DJ.

Music has taken Smola around the world. Her solo touring credits include concerts in Monaco, Spain, Belgium, Croatia, France, England, Azerbaijan, the United States, and throughout the Russian Federation.

Since August 2016, Smola has served as a professor of music at the University of Nebraska at Omaha. In last 5 years, she appeared in the theater productions "Indecent", "Morozko" and "The Legend of Sleeping Hollow" as a music director, cultural consultant, arranger, actress violinist, and composer of the stage music.

Peter Somos – Drums/percussion



Growing up in Budapest, Peter started working professionally at the age of 14. He's a summa cum laude graduate of the Codarts University of Music in Rotterdam. Throughout his career he has performed with artists such as Casey Benjamin, Mahesh Vinayakram, Nadishana, Sharrie Williams, Besh o droM, Sylvain Barou, Machito Crespo, Guy Bernfeld, Krzysztof Scieranski, Ralph Kaminski, and appeared on recordings alongside musicians like Dawid Podsiadło, Rhani Krija and Hayden Chisholm.

He's also performed in festivals like Sziget (HU), Exit (SR), WOMADelaide (AUS), Meskie Granie, Jamboree, Opener' (PL), Sudtirol Jazz (IT), JodhpurRIFF, Kolkata Jazz (IN), Nebraska Jazz (US), Shanghai World Music (CN), Jeju World Music (KR), Dubai Blues (UAE), and more.

Marie Sønderskov – flute



Exploiting the endless possibilities for producing sound with her instrument, Marie Sønderskov

cultivates the beauty of the unknown. Working with internationally acclaimed composers, she has premiered pieces for solo flute in venues all over the world. Ms. Sønderskov also regularly participates in cross-aesthetic collaborations with artists which combine diverse art forms with music, performance art and improvisations.

Marie Sønderskov is fluent in many musical genres and plays a variety of flutes including piccolo, alto flute, bass flute and baroque flute. She specializes in contemporary music and regularly performs and records pop and world music. In addition, she has studied jazz improvisation and Gagaku (an ancient form of Japanese music).

A.L.O.'s musicians perform regularly in renowned halls including Carnegie Hall, Tonhalle Zurich, and in worldrenowned music festivals such as North Sea Jazz, Jazz Baltica, and Montreal Jazz Festival and have been awarded numerous prizes. individually. toechter



toechter is a German Danish band researching the use of stringed instruments in sound design. Using their classical training as a starting point, they explore the percussive and lyrical range of the acoustic instruments, drawing on sound effects created through pedals and vocal textures, toechter creates electronic beats and soundscapes by manipulating acoustic stringed instrument sounds (violin, viola, violoncello). Together they create their own language by mixing genres and unusual string sound samples to create a human and touching electronic sound world.

In March 2022 they released their debut album "Zephyr" which was nominated for Opus Klassisk and awarded a place on the Quarterly Critic's Choice 03/2022 by "Preis der deutschen Schallplattenkritik" in the category Electronic and Experimental.

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





























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
