"I found the concept of this unique project to be irresistible: 'Pop'-influenced music for a Classical string quartet. Almost as irresistible as the musicians involved. The 'Afiaras' (as I like to call them) are astonishingly equidistant from tradition and innovation. And so I sought to create for them my own kind of 'collision of old and new', where the beauty and meaning of vintage poems might inspire the kind of loops, grooves, and catchy tunes heard in Pop. The melodies are, in fact, settings of the poem texts with the words stripped away. Contained in 'A Letter from the After-life' are two quotes from Schubert's Death & the Maiden quartet. Ironically, they struck me as being Pop-like and so I allowed them to emerge as though improvised; then to be improvised upon."

Children of God is a musical about an Oji-Cree family written by Oji-Cree composer, Corey Payette. In the musical, children Tommy and Julia are taken from their family and sent to a religious boarding school in Ontario. Gimikwenden Ina, a song from the musical, is sung by Tommy as he tries to remember what he is called, where he is from, and the family members that he left.

William-Linthicum Blackhorse (1989) - Chanté Wašté Hokšíla

This Lakota lullaby was traditionally sung by mothers towards their young boys, though the song was, and still is, sung to all children regardless of gender. Old songs are often mistaken for having no words because many of the ancient vocabulary were single syllables and, to the non-native speaker/singer, they sound like assorted, meaningless vowels.

Jarana

Lead Daniel Martinez formed Jarana in 2009 for versatility and added creative energy. Pronounced JaRaNa (HAH-RAH-nah), it is a noun and verb meaning an event when all ages come together socially in a public place to enjoy and celebrate with food, games, music and dancing. It's used much like the English "party," but with richer meaning and more energy.

Jarana is a band built on energetic, danceable music blending South American music styles, Mexican folk music and Latin dance styles. Jarana's music blends South American, African and Mediterranean beats such as Flamenco, Rumba and Salsa, accompanied with authentic, traditional instruments. Band members are natives of Peru, Mexico and the US.
